Today the Gundecha family gave a wonderful Dhrupad performance as a tribute to the late Vidushi Manju Mehta ji, senior disciple of sitarist Bharat Ratna Pandit Ravi Shankar ji and organizer and co-founder of Saptak music festival that has been happening in Ahmedabad for 45 years. A short interactive exercise with the audience in Raga Charukesi on the request of Smt. Bharti Chokshi was welcomed by the audience! Pandit Akhilesh Gundecha provided energetic sangat on the pakhaawaj and Dhani Gundecha provided excellent vocal support.
